Characters in Sinclair Lewis's Main Street

Note: There are some minor characters who appear in the book whom I have not included on this list, but I believe this list includes everyone a reader needs to know to be able to understand the story

Following conventions of the early 20th century, some of the married women are referred to as "Mrs. Husband's Name" (i.e., Mrs. Will Kennicott). Others are referred to by their given name (i.e., Mrs. Carol Kennicott). I have endeavored to include the first names of all women whose first names are given in the novel.

The Kennicotts

Carol Kennicott: The heroine and protagonist of *Main Street* through whose consciousness the story unfolds. An idealistic young woman who marries a small-town doctor and moves to his hometown of Gopher Prairie, Minnesota, harboring dreams of reforming and improving the town.

Will Kennicott: The doctor she marries. Rather stodgy and more conservative than Carol might have hoped he would be.

Hugh Kennicott: Their son, born about midway through the book. (Carol later gives birth to a daughter also, but the daughter is not named in the book)

Mrs. Kennicott: Will's mother, who appears in the book only briefly

Whittier and Bessie Smails: Will Kennicott's uncle and aunt, who move in with Will and Carol for a time, much to Carol's chagrin

Townspeople (Major Characters)

Bea Sorenson (Bjornstrom): The Kennicotts' hired girl, who moves to Gopher Prairie the same day Carol does; later marries Miles Bjornstrom

Vida Sherwin (Wutherspoon): Teacher at the Gopher Prairie High School, Carol's foil and sometimes best friend. Later marries Raymie Wutherspoon of the Bon Ton store.

Guy Pollock: A local attorney who shares some of Carol's cultural ambitions.

Mrs. Bogart: A sour, gossipy old widow

Cy Bogart: Her jackass of a son

Erik Valborg: A tailor and would-be artist and actor for whom Carol develops a fondness

Miles Bjornstrom: Handyman and village atheist who seems to hate everything about Gopher Prairie; called "the Red Swede" by many in town

Percy Bresnahan: A Gopher Prairie native who moved east and became president of the Velvet Motor Company; aside from one scene, he is mostly just referred to by the residents of Gopher Prairie

Fern Mullins: A new schoolteacher in Gopher Prairie who becomes embroiled in a scandal

Townspeople (Minor Characters)

Mr. and Mrs. Luke Dawson: wealthy landowner and moneylender in Gopher Prairie and his wife.

Ezra Stowbody: Town banker.

Miss Ella Stowbody: His daughter, reputed to be great elocutionist

Nat Hicks: Town tailor.

Mr. Harry and Mrs. Juanita Haydock: Owner of the Bon Ton Store and his lively wife. Mrs. Haydock is president of the Jolly Seventeen, a club of prominent women in Gopher Prairie

Raymie Wutherspoon: Works for Harry Haydock at Bon Ton Store. Later marries Vida Sherwin.

Mr. Sam and Mrs. Ethel Clark: Owner of the local hardware store and his wife.

Mr. and Mrs. Lyman Cass: Owner of a local flour mill and his wife.

Mr. and Mrs. Champ Perry: An elderly couple who have lived in Gopher Prairie since pioneer days

Mr. Dave and Mrs. Maud Dyer: A druggist and his wife

Mr. and Mrs. Julius Flickerbaugh: A wealthy attorney and his wife

Dr. and Mrs. Westlake: An elderly doctor in competition with Will Kennicott and his wife

Dr. and Mrs. McGanum: Dr. Westlake's partner and son-in-law, and his wife

Dr and Mrs. Harvey Dillon: A dentist and his wife, whom Carol befriends

The Rev. Leonard and Mrs. Warren: The Congregationalist pastor and wife. The latter is president of the Thanatopsis Club

Loren Wheeler: Editor of Gopher Prairie's newspaper, the Dauntless

Peter and Helga Rustad: A Scandinavian farmer and his wife whom Will Kennicott treats

Miss Ethel Villets: Town librarian

Oscarina: The hired girl who replaces Bea when Bea marries Miles Bjornstrom

James Blausser: A profession booster hired to "boost" Gopher Prairie
